


## The countdown has begun...





- If students are in every lesson, every day, giving 100% effort and focus then interventions should not be needed.
- We do recognise, however, that we need to run small, targeted interventions for those students who need it. This will be to address a knowledge gap or support a further learning need.
- On going assessments, mocks and marked class work will be looked at regularly to ensure we are giving the additional support to the right students
- If your child is requested at an intervention, they must attend. This is to ensure they are successful in that subject
- ❖ We are looking at the school calendar and where there will be a need for bespoke focused interventions e.g. drop down morning / afternoons for those practical subjects with coursework deadlines to support our students too.

# CHRISTMAS CAROL Charles Dickens

#### Questions

**Section A Shakespeare:** students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

**Section B The 19th-century novel:** students will answer one question on their novel of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole.



#### Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

#### What's assessed

- Modern prose or drama texts
- The poetry anthology
- Unseen poetry

#### How it's assessed

- written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 96 marks
- 60% of GCSE



#### Questions

**Section A Modern texts:** students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied modern prose or drama text.

**Section B Poetry:** students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster.

**Section C Unseen poetry:** Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.





## Our Science Curriculum and Support

- 9 Science lessons over the fortnight for Double/Combined students
- 14 Science lessons over the fortnight for Separate Science students
- Science intervention form, for targeted students, two days a week (Thursday and Friday) focussing on revision techniques
- Every lesson to comprise of past examination question
- Revision guides provided for all students free of charge
- Target revision assigned every Friday, using revision guides and then an assessed examination question the following Friday
- Weekly targeted Intervention revision sessions on a Wednesday
- Easter and Whitsun Intervention sessions provided with a specialist in all 3 Science disciplines
- Structured revision programme to be devised
- Mrs Lennon, Trust Maths Director support on Wednesdays
- Mrs Lennon Assembly on preparing for Science GCSE's
- Masterclass, focussing on maths and science practical skills
- Masterclass, focussing on the REQUIRED PRACTICALS



# How parents and guardians can support at home



- Always positively encourage your child, tell them that they can do it!
- Encourage small and often revision, 30 50 mins per night, there is a lot of science content to revise
- Encourage them to keep to the weekly revision schedule
- Buy them blank revision cards
- Occasionally test them with their revision cards
- Support and encourage them, that will boost confidence and productivity!

## Year 11 Science Exam Information



 In Combined Science and Triple Science students will sit 6 exam papers, 1hr and 15mins for both Higher and Foundation for the combined papers and 1hr 45 mins both Higher and Foundation for the separate papers

- Biology Paper 1 : (units 4.1 4.4)
- Biology Paper 2: (units 4.5 4.7)
- Chemistry Paper 1: (units 5.1-5.5)
- Chemistry Paper 2 : (units 5.6 5.10)
- Physics Paper 1: (units 6.1 -6.4)
- Physics Paper 2: (units 6.5 6.7)
- The final tier of entry will be determined based on prior attainment in previous MOCK examinations and end of unit tests

## Science Key Dates

- W/C 7<sup>th</sup> October = In Class Assessment covering paper 2 units from all 3 science Disciplines
- **W/C 16<sup>th</sup> January** = Paper 1 mock for Biology, Chemistry and Physics (3 papers in total)
- **W/C 20<sup>th</sup> March** = Paper 2 mock for Biology, Chemistry and Physics (3 papers in total)




